«Do children react more strongly to environmental pollutants?»

Children differ from adults with respect to several aspects which are relevant for assessing their health risk from environmental pollutants such as air pollution, noise, pesticides or radiation. Children may expose themselves differently and they may metabolize substances in a different manner. Effects on development during childhood are likely to have long-lasting health consequences.
